Meet BPB Families

The Kadjemba family of five arrived in Chicago in November 2019. They left their home in the Democratic Republic of Congo in 2018 and went to live in a refugee camp in Burundi. While at the camp they received word from the United Nations High Commission for Refugees and the U.S. Office of Refugee Resettlement that they would be resettled in Chicago.

Upon their arrival in Chicago, RefugeeOne, a local resettlement agency, provided them with a furnished apartment and assisted them in receiving food stamps, healthcare, ESL Training and employment guidance. By December the three adults (father, mother and oldest daughter) were employed and enrolled in English classes. The two younger children were enrolled in school and in RefugeeOne's Youth Program.

Then COVID-19 hit and all three adults became unemployed. Currently, all five family members are at home and continuing their English studies virtually. The father is actively job hunting and the mother and daughter are hoping to be rehired by their former employer.

In early May, BPB began to partner with RefugeeOne as co-sponsors and mentors for the Kadjemba family. Our Bridge Builder Team virtually meets weekly with them. Father Joseph, a friend of BPB, has generously donated his time to serve as our translator. English is new to all of them.

In our conversations, we addressed some of their most immediate needs including rental assistance, food and clothing.

We hope to enhance their understanding of American culture and support them in short-term goals. We look forward to meeting in person sometime soon!

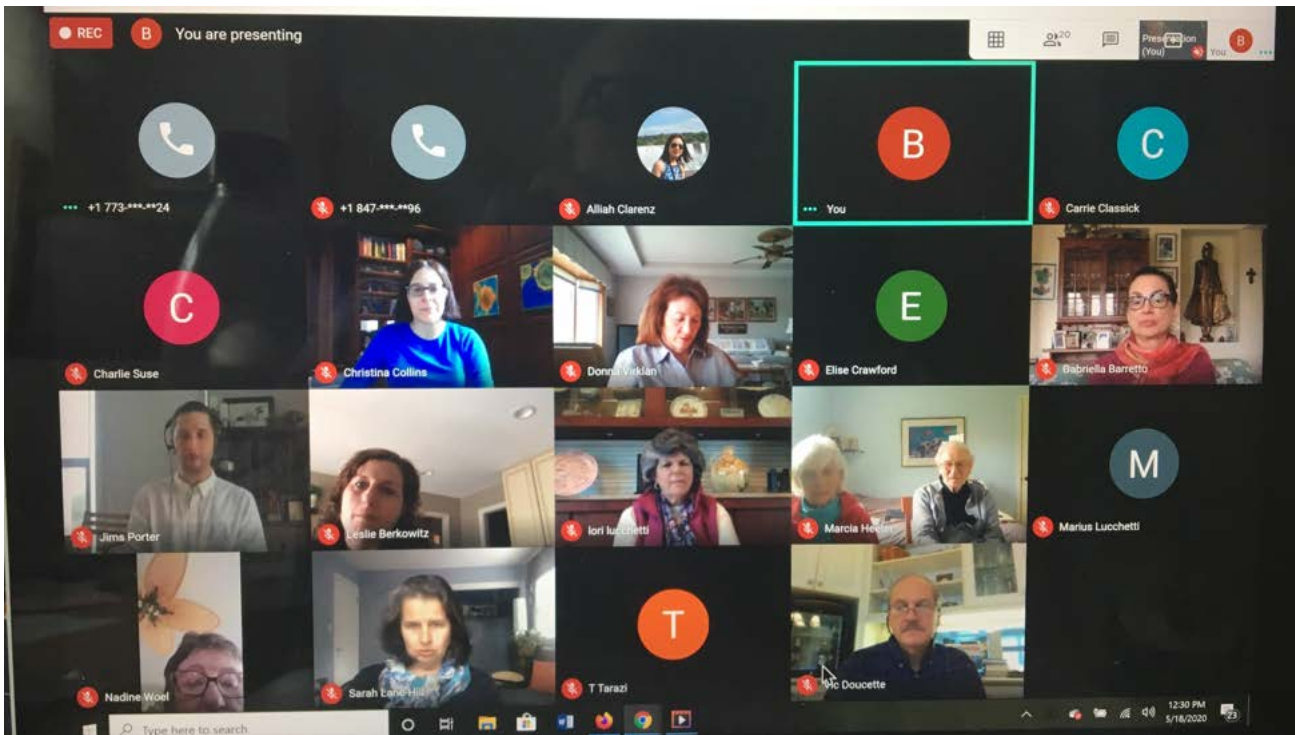

Learning Luncheons

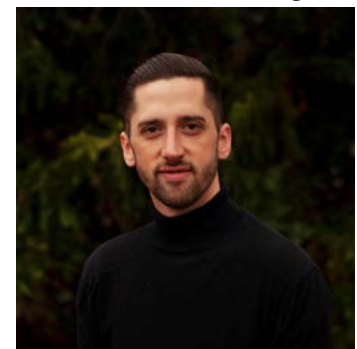
The Pandemic challenged BPB to explore a virtual alternative to our much loved luncheon meetings. While a virtual meeting does not provide the same opportunities for shared friendship and good food, our Bridge Builders requested us to continue the educational component of these events. BPB’s first virtual luncheon, May 18, had Jims Porter speak about “Refugee Resettlement and the COVID-19 Response.”

Jims is the Communications and Advocacy Manager at RefugeeOne, a refugee settlement agency in Chicago. Jims educated the audience about how the refugee settlement agency executes its mission of “creating opportunities for refugees fleeing war, terror, and persecution to build new lives of safety, dignity and self-reliance.” Their programs include English Language Training, Workforce Development, a Wellness Program, a Sewing Studio, a Youth and Young Adult Program, Women’s Services, and Immigration and Citizenship Assistance.

During the pandemic, RefugeeOne continues to provide support remotely. Staff help families navigate healthcare, mitigate lost wages and provide support to stay in their homes.

Jims also spoke to us about the Refugee Action Network (formerly Golden Door Coalition). The Network is a statewide coalition of refugee focused organizations, whose vision is to “foster the dignified resettlement and successful integration of refugee families into the fabric of our communities.” As a member of this coalition, BPB looks forward to sharing information and learning from our partners.

Refugee Families Fed

In March and April, BPB initiated a “Call to Action” to our Bridge Builders to immediately provide “Food Boxes” to refugee families. Due to COVID-19 many of the food pantries were bare. BPB responded by raising over \$2,000 and feeding over forty families. BPB donated to the ICNA Relief Food Pantry thereby providing hope and support to our local refugee families.

Before the current COVID-19 crisis, refugee families faced tremendous challenges in operating, integrating and, frankly, surviving in a new land with a new culture, a new language, and new rules. The anxiety and uncertainty we all have during this shutdown is more acute for these families who escaped unimaginable horrors and now face a new hardship. The food assistance helped families survive through these unprecedented times.
