Ahadi has joined a Long Haul Van Delivery Service, in order to provide for his family (Uber employment was not producing revenue). Bridge Builders are sponsoring the family for 6 months of half a month's rent, diapers and baby needs. We will provide coaching for Ahadi's path to U.S. citizenship.

Thanks to Carrie, Monique, Joanne, Tamara, and a network of young moms, who donated, collected and delivered baby items for Binja. Other Bridge Builders were thrilled to meet Binja and Hawa on a recent visit. The family is grateful for the support from Ellie, Ardita and Kerry.

She began Indiana University on January 19th studying medical sciences. The family has purchased property to rehab. It is a full family effort. Adam enjoys conversations with his preschool buddies as well as virtual visits with BPB. BPB will continue to provide academic support when needed and monthly financial coaching.

Bushra and Zeyad's family attended BPB's Annual Educational Event and screening of "Belonging". Our guests enjoyed the opportunity to speak with them about their story. Bushra will be baking Iraqi sweets for BPB's raffle winner Moshood.

Welcome to 2021! We welcome the Biden Administration prioritizing restructuring of the United States Immigration System which produces a resettlement process that is more humane and more welcoming. Immediate action was taken

by Executive Order lifting the Muslim ban and Immigration Reform legislation was sent to the Congress.

Democracy is America! Democracy is based on the U.S. Constitution that reads “all men are created equal.” Building Peaceful Bridges’ (BPB) mission is based on achieving social and economic justice for all of the refugees that enter the U.S. resettlement process. 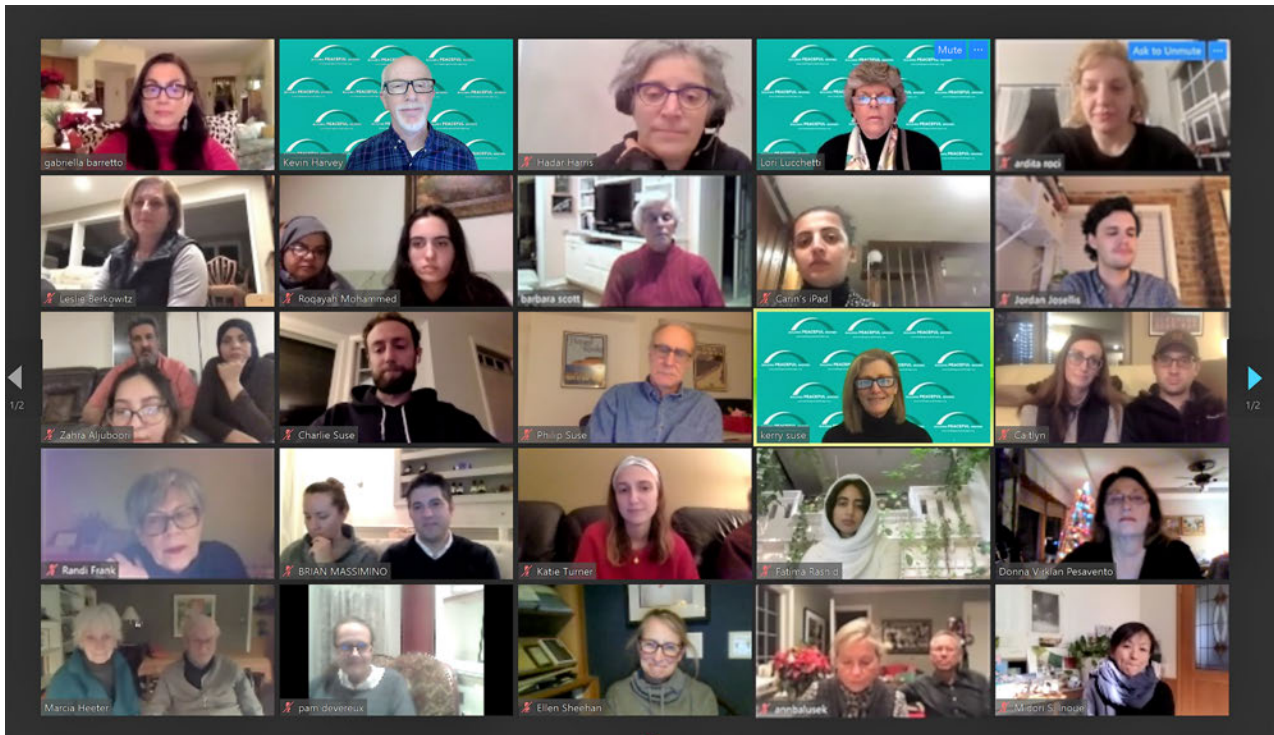
Bridge Builders

The highlight of the event was screening “Belonging”, a film that portrays the journey of a refugee family walking the path of resettlement, building relationships, and reaching U.S. citizenship. The film also tells the story of Ahlam and Roqayah, both of whom are Bridge Builders, and their path towards independence and self-sufficiency with the backing of their community and friends. Our guests learned about the founding of BPB and our mission from our board members.



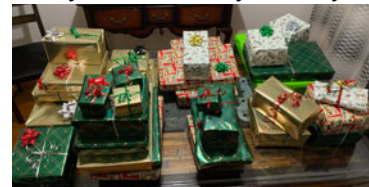
Housing Help - Call to Action
